





Whenever one walks into an automobile workshop, it is expected to see women either at the receptionists' desk or the back office. While these women have been excelling at these roles for years, it is still a rare sight to find ladies working on vehicles in the shop-floor or involved in technical aspects of automobile service. With a drive named "Pink Collars", Mahindra & Mahindra started an initiative to promote recruitment of women in core productive roles at automobile workshops.

The program encourages channel partners to tie up with Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) and impart up-to-date industrial knowledge through the company's expert trainers, provide automotive aggregates to support practical training and make the ITI students in dustry-ready. Special recruitment drives are conducted for girl students at these ITIs by Mahindra's authorized dealers to identify and recruit female talent.

Mahindra kicked off the first batch of Pink Collars in October 2018 and trained 22 girl students selected from various ITIs in districts of western Maharashtra at the Mahindra Institute of Learning Excellence (MILE), Igatpuri. At this high-tech state-of-the-art training

center, they underwent a free-ofcost 10-day residential training program that brushed up their theoretical basics and imparted practical skill development in automotive service and repair. Coming from the ITI trades of Motor Mechanic Vehicle, Diesel Mechanic and Automobile Diploma, the girls were quick in grasping concepts of modern automobile technology and were given hands-on training on Mahindra's range of vehicles. All the recruits went on to work as trainee technicians at Mahindra's authorized workshops.

After completing one year at a Mahindra authorize Workshop in Pune, one of the Pink Collars recruits - Kavita Koli says "I was always fascinated with cars when I saw my father, who is a driver, work on his vehicle. I am very thankful to the trainers at MILE and my mentors in the workshop for helping me realize my dream of working on automobiles." Kavita, who hails from Jalgaon district in Maharashtra, is one the 170 females who have broken gender stereotypes in the automobile industry by joining the core productive workforce at Mahindra's authorized workshops pan India in the last financial year.



Skilling, Reskilling in Industry

A voluminous number of 25000+ apprenticeship contracts have been generated by 500+establishments in the field of optional trades in the Automotive sector.

Currently 41 NAPS curriculum have been approved and are now available on the apprenticeship portal.

ASDC's first customised NAPS Course - 'Vehicle Manufacturing Operations'as per Ford India got approved on the Dec'20. Ford India will recruit women and persons with disability as apprentices under this course.

ASDC was sanctioned 1,11,868 numbers in Recognition of Prior Learning(RPL) project. ASDC have engaged 34 companies under RPL program which has certified 98,556 candidates.

Additionally 22,657 independent service technicians trained & assessed under the RPL program to upgrade their skills in BS6 norms.

World Skills Competition is also known as the "Olympics of Skills". It is a biennial event and the Largest Vocational Skill Competition in the World. There are more than 85 member countries competing in total of 56 skill categories in these competitions.

ASDC participates in 4 skill categories viz. Automobile Technology, Autobody Repair, Car Painting and Prototype Modelling. So far, ASDC had won¹ Bronze Medal and 5 Medallion of Excellence in the previous World Skills Competitions held in Abu Dhabi in 2017 and Kazan, Russia in 2019.

To make India the "Skill Capital of the World", it is imperative to showcase the country's expertise in various skills across the globe. To achieve the above established target ASDC is reaching out to various remote parts of the country and is encouraging the Indian youth to participate in the India Skills Competitions and get an opportunity to represent India at the Global level.

TRAINING PARTNERS

Since its inception ASDC has deployed – well trained 1607 Trainers and 704 Assessors in all the 4 Domains of Sales, Service, Driving and Manufacturing of the Auto Industry.

During the Financial Year 2019-20 ASDC had trained the highest number of Trainers. During this period ASDC held 45 batches and has certified 568 trainers. Similarly, ASDC held 25 batches and has certified 283 assessors.


