Celebrating 100 years of Champaran Satyagraha Movement

MoSDE organized exhibition and events coinciding with the centenary anniversary of Satyagraha Movement by Mahatma Gandhi. ASDC participated in the event organized at Motihari, Bihar.

The exhibition was visited by Hon'ble Minister Shri Rajiv Pratap Rudy, and Shri Radha Mohan Jha, Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare. During the event, ASDC showcased various opportunities for skill development in Automobile sector. Inauguration of Driver Training Institute in Deoghar, Jharkhand

In order to meet the growing demand of skilled driver across the country, Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India up driver training institutes (DTI) across the country. The driver training institute was inaugurated by the Honorable President of India in Godda, Jharkhand. The President further laid the foundation stone for two more DTIs in Deoghar and Ranchi. During the event, MSDE also organized a four day skill exhibition and 3 day rozgar mela. ASDC participated in the event sharing with visiting aspirants career opportunities linked to various skill development opportunies in the automobile sector. More than 6000 candidates visited the exhibition over two days. ASDC also facilitated placement for several candidates during the Rozgar Mela.

Expert Group Meeting-Manufacturing Cluster

The 3rd and 4th Expert Group Meeting were held on 16th and 19th March 2017 respectively at ASDC office in New Delhi. During the meeting ASDC Expert Group (AEG) worked on rationalization and evaluation of the current National Occupational Standards/Qualification Packs (QP/NOS) for manufacturing clusters such as Welding and Plastic Molding. This will help in matching the evolving standards for vocational training in the automobile sector. Experts from Eicher Volvo (Ex-MD), Hero Moto Corp, Sandhar Automotive discussed various ideas with ASDC team.

In order to institutionalize the leading role that Automobile Industry is expected to play, it is important that various activities carried out by ASDC are continuously guided by our Automobile Industry. In line with this approach.

Industry Engagement

In order to bridge the demand and supply gap of skilled manpower in the manufacturing side of automotive sector, ASDC has been reaching out to corporates to leverage synergies.

Already, there are ASDC centres running at Hero Moto Corp and various locations of Sansera Engineering. With these successfully running centres as a case study, ASDC is in dialogue with several other organizations to replicate the model. In this regard a dialogue has been initiated with some of the prominent auto part manufacturing companies including Sandhar Group, Lumax, Subros, JBM among others.
