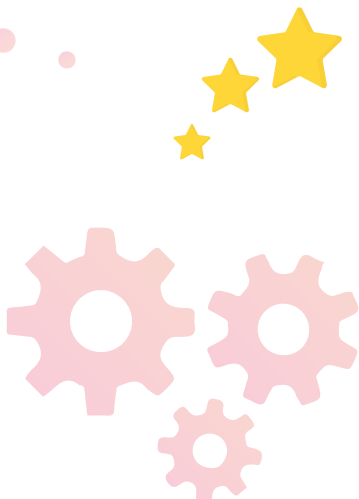
Fit India Plogging Run

Roundtable Discussion organised by Department for International Development



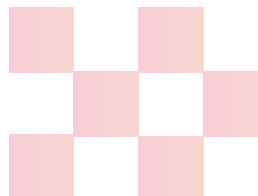

- The initiative has been launched under the CSR initiative of Shriram Transport, which aims to foster Public Private Partnership collaboration under the Skill India mission

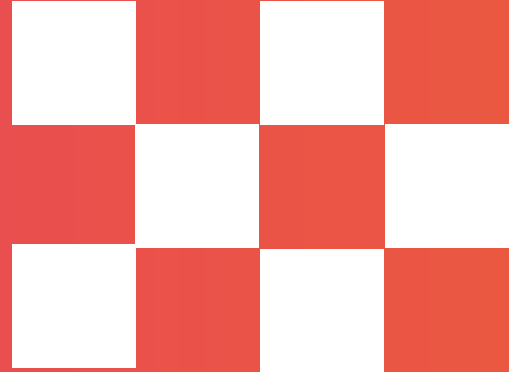
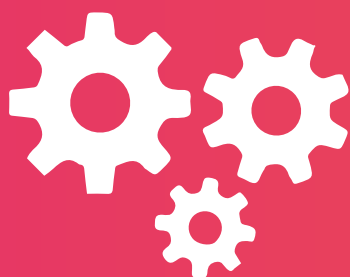


Recognition of Prior Learning
